



First Lund Qualitative Research Summer School 2020

WORKING WITH QUALITATIVE DATA: WRITING FOR PUBLICATION

Lund University, Sweden,
June 8-12, 2020

How do you analyze and write up findings from qualitative data? How do you structure and revise a journal article manuscript? How do you publish to build a career?

This new one-week Summer School is designed to teach Ph.D. students and post-docs in the social sciences some of the steps involved in successfully analyzing, writing up and publishing their research. It is suited for all early career social scientists (such as sociology, social anthropology, social work, political sciences, education, communication, etc.) who conduct qualitative research and work with qualitative data. Participants are asked to bring an English language manuscript in progress (e.g. a book chapter, journal article, dissertation chapter, etc.) that they are working on.

The building blocks of the Lund Summer School include talks, discussions, workshops, individual meetings and small group sessions for peer feedback and writing. It is taught by seven experienced social scientists from three countries who will pass on some of the lesser-known tricks and strategies of successful academic analysis, writing and career building which they have learned throughout years of working in academia.

TIME SCHEDULE AND ORGANIZATION

When: June 8-12 (Monday – Friday), from 9 to 17 daily (Arrival date: June 7)

Where: Faculty of Social Sciences, Lund University, Sweden. Venue: School of Social Work, Allhelgona Kyrkogata 8, Lund.

Application Due Date: February 15th, 2020.

Participant Selection and Notification: March 15, 2020.

Fee: 2500 SEK (≈ €230 or USD 260) including tuition, daily “fika” (coffee break) and one dinner. Travel and accommodation costs are not included.

Submission of manuscript-in-progress: May 15, 2020

Accommodation: Not included. Approximate cost for 6 nights: 5000-8000 SEK (≈€470-750 or ≈USD 520-850). Dorms at a hostel or Airbnb may be a cheaper alternative. Recommended hotels or hostels will be announced.

How to Apply: Send your name, affiliation, current status, contact information, and a 2 page description of (1) your completed research and collected data sets, and (2) your writing project (chapter, article, grant application, etc.) and plans to: Malin Åkerström at: malin.akerstrom@soc.lu.se, by January 31, 2020.

Participants: Around 20 participants will be selected. Priority will be given to Ph.D. students.
